General Education Outcomes

Communication



Goal:

Students who graduate from KCC will be able to create and interpret messages within specific contexts and multiple channels and modalities.

Fall 2022

- Reintroduced new Gen Ed Outcomes to faculty at Inservice.
- Faculty selected outcomes for each of their courses, where applicable.



- Completed norming activity at Inservice using a few student artifacts and the rubric.
- Provided faculty with a list of their randomly sampled students.
- Faculty assessed the randomly sampled students and recorded data.

Findings

A total of 93 courses across 31 different disciplines were assessed for this outcome.

398 responses were collected for this assessment.

- 38% performed at the highest level, full and complete.
- 38% performed at the reasonable level.
- 15% performed at the partial understanding level.
- 9% performed at the minimal understanding level

Overall, 76% of the students performed at or above the reasonable level, which was the target.

Spring 2023



- Student Learning Committee (SLC) requested recommendations from faculty who completed assessments.
- SLC analyzed data and recommendations.
- SLC created recommendations to share with college in Fall 2023. Results will be shared with faculty at Inservice and with the college via the portal.



Rubric Criteria

Student performance was assessed based on their ability to demonstrate:

- a full and complete understanding of all content and practices essential to communicating within the assigned channel and modality.
- a reasonable understanding of all content and practices essential to communicating within the assigned channel and modality.
- a partial understanding of all content and practices essential to communicating within the assigned channel and modality.
- a minimal understanding of the content and practices essential to communicating within the assigned channel and modality.

Recommendations

- SLC should provide additional training regarding General Education Assessment best practices and various modes of assessing these outcomes.
- Encourage faculty to provide formative feedback early in the semester to increase the likelihood of student improvement throughout the term.
- Additional direct instruction related to the theory behind and the skills related to Communication should be offered in each course.
- Content experts in Communication Theory should provide examples and assistance to those teaching communication in their area of study.
- Increased collaboration between those teaching Communication and Student Success Center Staff.
 For example, Faculty could provide examples of assignments and rubrics with Tutoring Staff.
- Provide additional reading support to students to assist them in class preparation.
- Provide faculty with additional support and training related to student engagement and retention.
