COURSE STRENGTHS:

20/24 students passed PNUR 1316. As of this report we have had <u>17</u> of the 20 students take the NCLEX and pass for 100% pass rate thus far.

This is the second summer that the students took the HURST review at the end of their program in preparation for boards. We received positive feedback from the students, and we are seeing positive results on the boards.

COURSE IMPROVEMENTS:

- To better prepare students for acute care, it was discussed that an addition of some
 acute care clinical experience to PNUR 1140 would be beneficial in Spring 2025. The
 team discussed the potential to have four weeks in assisted living, four weeks in longterm care, and four weeks in acute rehab care to help to prepare students for
 inpatient acute care clinical.
- NGN-style guestions were added to exams built by faculty members.
- No-backtracking was allowed on exams to better prepare students for the NCLEX.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COURSE/CURRICULUM/DEVELOPMENT REVISION

Course Outcome #1:

Part 1: met.

Part 2: partially met, however improvement noted from summer of 2023 findings (see Report & Analysis for CO#1). Will emphasize the importance of knowing the CEU requirements defined in the Illinois NPA and the renewal period cycle. This content is addressed on the NPA assignment but will add more classroom discussion & continue with content in the Jeopardy classroom activity. Further discussion will include the nurse's responsibility to self-monitor, maintain documentation of CEU accrual, & where information is located on the IDFPR website describing what constitutes a CEU and/or equivalent during the renewal period cycle.

Course Outcome #2: Just an observation that all students must meet this outcome to pass the course. We will consider measuring something else next summer.

Course Outcome #3: At this time, we will not revise the method of assessment. We would like to compare to the summer 2025 cohort's results prior to making any changes as the summer 2024 cohort may be an outlier to the norm.

Course Outcome #4: We had 10 students score under 850 on the exit exam. Their scores ranged from 762-838. We will continue to encourage students to review their previous HESI final exams to identify their weaker areas. This will help them prepare more effectively for the 1316 Final Exit Exam. In response to these low scores, additional HESI exams were added to seminar class (Pharmacology V2 and Medical/Surgical V2).

In Spring 2025, it may be more beneficial to add these additional HESI exams for points prior to the EXIT exam for review.

Course Outcome #5- We had some students not even recognize the cultural part of the simulation because they didn't understand that there were two dads, and this was a surrogate pregnancy. In the future maybe this should be a part of the chart so we can

evaluate this outcome more thoroughly. Also, one group was prepared to go against the patient's wishes as a practicing Jehovah's Witness refusing blood transfusion in an emergent situation. This provoked a thoughtful discussion of the best way to address when patients re refusing care during a critical time.

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
